Municipal Bylaws

Bylaw No. 77

A BYLAW OF THE SUMMER VILLAGE OF SILVER BEACH TO PROHIBIT THE KEEPING OR MAINTAINING OF ANY ANIMALS, POULTRY OR FOWL WITHIN THE CONFINES OF THE VILLAGE

Under the authority vested in the Council of the Summer Village of Silver Beach by the *Municipal Government Act*, Section 161, the Council of the Summer Village of Silver Beach enacts as follows:

- (1) Subject to Section (2) of this Bylaw no person shall keep any one or more animals, poultry or fowl within the corporate limits from time to time of the Summer Village of Silver Beach.
- (2) For the purpose of this Bylaw, the word “poultry” and “fowl” mean live domestic fowl including ducks, turkey, geese, hens, pigeons and chickens.
- (3) This Bylaw does not apply to cats or dogs.
- (4) Any person who violates the provisions of this Bylaw shall be guilty of an offence and shall upon summary conviction be liable to the penalties as hereinafter set out:

A fine not to exceed \$100.00 and costs and in default thereof to imprisonment not exceeding 60 days in the nearest common gaol unless the fine and costs including the costs of committal are sooner paid.

Read a first time the 6th day of June 1973.

Read a second time the 6th day of June 1973.

Resolution by C. Ouimette that the authority be given to proceed with the third reading at this meeting. Unanimously carried.

Read a third time and finally passed the 6th day of June 1973.
